Who We Are

The Acapella Rising Chorus is an all-male barbershop chorus consisting of approximately 35 men. It was chartered in 1955 as a chapter of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barbershop Quartet Singing in America, Inc. (SPEBSQSA), now known as the Barbershop Harmony Society. As such, it is part of the largest non-profit men's singing group in America with over 34,000 members worldwide. It is the only men's chorus of this type in Little Rock.

The Acapella Rising Chorus is devoted to singing America's unique barbershop style of music which originated in the early 1900's when, for entertainment, men congregated in barbershops or on street corners to sing in close harmony. Its repertoire covers the classic songs of the early 1900's as well as many modern compositions. From patriotic numbers to religious songs, from love songs to comedic songs, from up tunes to ballads, our repertoire is sure to include something to please any ear.
